some of the early debates

around the Constitution so the notion that we used to have this thing of an objective
media that was just presenting

you the facts that is actually the initial disinformation of all this that's not true that was
never true

you get into the 20th century and you get into the evolution of true mass media right I
mean yeah newspaper is

fine we got the printing press we get to newspapers um uh but once you have radio
which is

what I what I do now obviously Mo it's my primary uh day-to-day job but then the
evolution of television and

Vietnam war boom done we're losing right that was perception now it wasn't really that simple but there was a power that

they had that had ebbed away the power that they have replaced that with with the dominance of social media

platforms which are not just Democrat aligned which are truly left-wing

evangelist run and operated which is what we had seen far outstripped I think what they had

had let's say in the you know the 80s going into the 90s or or at a previous era because they set these things up

I'm not sure if it was ever actually attributed to him but anyway he's a former agency guy and he was one of the guys who would talk about how this would

go there and kill bad guys we got to get out but this whole nation-building thing of any kind no chance that he wrote that

people that I thought were badass at their job left 25 stayed but 75 left
