1:24 not for a reprisal on past decisions 1:29 we're here to actually once again come 1:33 to the face of the human condition and 1:36 ask the question who do we want to be 1:39 what do we want Humanity to look like 1:42 and rather than seeing this as an 1:44 exercise in futility which is very easy 1:46 from time to time when you're in the 1:49 position I'm in 1:51 I actually see this not as an exercise 1:53 in futility I see this as one of the 1:55 greatest opportunities that faces us 1:57 because we now have a public 1:58 conversation 2:00

which is now front and center in 2:01 people's minds when this was an esoteric 2:03 conversation about biological patents 2:06 nobody cared 2:08 but when that conversation came home 2:11 then it became something people can care 2:13 about 2:14 so I'm actually quite grateful for this 2:16 opportunity I thank the members of 2:18 parliament for hosting this I thank all 2:21 of the translators who I apologize in 2:23 advance I will use terminology that is 2:25 probably very difficult to translate so 2:27 my apologies 2:28 I'd also like to acknowledge the fact

2:31 that many of you are aware of my 2:33 involvement with this in large part due 2:36 to the amazing work of my wonderful wife 2:38 Kim Martin 2:40 who encouraged me at the very early days 2:42 of this pandemic to get on front of the 2:44 camera and talk about all the 2:47 information that I had been sharing 2:48 among very small groups around the world 2:52 and it was in fact her encouragement 2:54 that put me in a place where many of you 2:57 have heard what I have to say 3:00 ironically the world that I came from 3:03 that used to be very popular my CNBC and 3:06

Bloomberg presentations which were

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televised on mainstream media around the 3:10 world was an audience that I lost I I 3:13 can confidently say covid diminished my 3:15 fame 3:17 but I can also confidently say that I'd 3:19 rather stand among the people with whom 3:21 I'm standing today than any of the folks 3:25 that were part of that previous world so 3:28 this is a much better place to be my 3:30 role today is to set the stage for this 3:32 conversation in a historical context 3:35 because this did not come in the last 3:37 three years this did not come in the 3:39 last five or six years this actually is

one of these things 4:20 up there we go 4:23 most of you don't know that coronavirus 4:26 as a model of a pathogen was isolated in 4:30 1965. 4:33 coronavirus was identified in 1965 as 4:36 one of the first infectious 4:40 replicatable viral models that could be 4:43 used to modify a series of other 4:46 experiences of human condition it was 4:48 isolated Once Upon a Time associated 4:51 with the common cold 4:53 but what's particularly interesting 4:54 about its isolation in 1965 was that it 4:58 was immediately identified as a pathogen 5:00 that could be used and modified for a 5:03 whole host of reasons and you heard me 5:05 correctly that was 1965 and by the way 5:07 these slides are public domain you're 5:10 welcome to look at every single 5:12 reference every comment that I made is 5:14 based on published material so do make 5:17 sure that you look at those references 5:19 but in 1966 the very first COV 5:24 coronavirus model was used as a 5:27 transatlantic biological experiment in 5:30 human manipulation and you heard the 5:32 date 1966. 5:36 I hope you're getting the point of what
